Didik-Kasih Educare Program

Under the Didik-Kasih EduCare Program, GVCA has been aiding underprivileged students in pursuing their tertiary studies by providing them with study aid fund. In return the students are required to organise and lead a charity project to give back to the society.



First project for this year was undertaken by Rose, a Didik-Kasih EduCare candidate pursuing a Diploma in Mass Communication. On 20th January 2017, a craft workshop was organised for the children at Rumah Kanak-Kanak Impian (RKKI). Besides spending quality time making craft with the children, Rose also encouraged them to study hard to excel in life. Rose further donated necessity goods and RM300 to RKKI via the program.



Second project was undertaken by Vinayagi, a Didik-Kasih EduCare candidate pursuing a Diploma in Psychology. On 11th March 2017, she led 24 children from Rumah Ozanam to an educational tour to

Third project was undertaken by Tierra Ooi who is pursuing a Degree in Psychology. On 25th March 2017, she organized a charity project entitled "The Beauty of Darkness" in collaboration with the Malaysian Foundation for the Blind (MFB). The aim of this project is to raise awareness among students in Segi College with regards to the visually impaired. In cooperating with MFB, Tierra has taught her peers the right ways of assisting the visually impaired. Students were exposed to the experience of being visually impaired through activities like "blind walk" and having lunch blind folded. The participants enjoyed the program and many have claimed that they now have a better awareness about the visually impaired.
