PRUKasih Program

In the second quarter of 2020, due to the MCO, a temporary process measure was in place with the beneficiary claimants of PRUKasih receiving their claims via direct bank transfer instead of food voucher handouts throughout the quarter. A total of 14 claims for illnesses, accidents, and death, amounting RM16,688 have been approved to disburse to the affected members in the quarter under review. Meanwhile, 6 residents were enrolled to the program when recruitment resumes in Jun 20.



PRUKASIH HIGHLIGHTS



KHAIRUDIN (ILLNESS CLAIM)

Mr Khairuddin is a lorry driver and has leukemia. He will use the PRUKasih aid to pay for his treatment. In Jun 20, GVCA also assisted him with Rakan Shopping grocery aid. With the help, we hope he will be able to get through this difficulty.



ZAITON (DEATH CLAIM)

Mdm Zaiton lost her husband and main financial support a few months ago due to asthma. She uses the condolences money, food aid, and rental aid from PRUKasih to support her living expenses and also arranged a tahlil ceremony for her deceased husband to rest in peace.



PULSE FREE COVID-19 PROTECTION

During the MCO, Prudence Foundation launched a free Covid-19 Protection Plan via the PULSE app, which was also extended to PRUKasih members. Members who were diagnosed with Covid-19 can receive up to RM1,000 cash-relief upon hospitalisation. This free Covid-19 protection plan has provided an additional protection on top of the PRUKasih plan.

Didik-Kasih EduCare Program

In second quarter of 2020, there were 22 candidates enrolled with the program, aimed at providing needy students with a startup assistance and monthly study allowances for their tertiary education, while guiding them to give back to the society via charity projects. 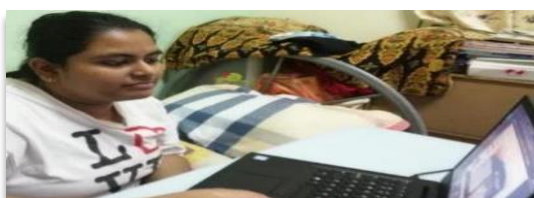
JENNESSA ROSE
